- 1. Prayerfully consider joining us THIS SUNDAY FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP AT CHURCH (June 28, 2020) at 11:00 AM SERVICE ONLY if you feel comfortable and are personally ready to do so, by adhering to the safety and health protections and precautions outlined below.
- 2. Please purchase, wear, and/or bring
- face mask that covers your nose and mouth (Kroger, Walmart, Home Depot, Walgreens, etc. Masks are required unless you have a medical condition that prevents your wearing of one);
- hand sanitizer in a travel/personal-sized dispenser;
- locate, complete, and submit a copy of the District's Health Acknowledgment Form supplied to you by mail by Foundry, also available on the Church's website, and also available for online completion and submission at this link: <a href="https://www.evc.vaumc.org/open/worshipregistration/Page1.cfm">https://www.evc.vaumc.org/open/worshipregistration/Page1.cfm</a>. The Health Acknowledgment Form must be submitted WEEKLY at last four (4) days before the service by end of the day on Wednesday, June 24, 2020 to Pastor Matt only by phone, mail, email, fax, or directly online through the link. Please do not submit the form to the Church Office because it is confidential, private medical information deemed appropriate for submission to Pastor Matt only by the District and Conference guidelines; and
- call the Church Office or email Kathy Dziagwa WEEKLY to make a reservation to attend the 11:00 A.M. service on Sunday, June 28, 2020. We have to use a reservation system to adhere to social distancing of 6 feet and plan pew seating in advance. We thank you for accommodating this extra preparation in the short-term and apologize for the inconvenience. Please also make this reservation at least four (4) days before the service by the end of the day on Wednesday, June 24, 2020.
- You will be asked at the Church entrance doors if you have submitted the Health Form and made a reservation, and if anything has changed since you submitted same.
- Your temperature will be taken by an infrared thermometer a few inches from your forehead.
- 3. Please adopt a patient and grace-filled spirit. We are in this together to stay safe and healthy, not be fearful, and return to in-person worship in God's House. Please continue to pray for safety, health, and protection.
- 4. Children from birth and up may attend. We have a one-room children's classroom for ages 0-6 with a video and book-based lesson and caregivers. If over 2 years, they must wear a mask. Children of all ages are part of the advanced registration and health form submission process for our planning and social distancing preparations. Children age 7 and up may attend the worship service. Please bring no extra items with children that are not mandatory for safety and health reasons.
- 5. Entry and exit from the Church is marked by tape and cones, there is a registration process at the door, access to the building is restricted to the sanctuary, narthex, bathrooms, and as applicable, to the children's wing classroom and bathrooms. We will not be using Ebert Hall, the remainder of the Adult Wing, or kitchen for safety and health reasons. Please allow a little more time for your arrival and departure due to the registration process and ushered seating to arrive and depart the sanctuary to adhere to social distancing of 6 feet.
- 6. Online worship will still continue to be offered through Zoom and Facebook Live.
- 7. There is no live singing permitted at this time. We can hum, sing in our hearts, dance, and praise though.
- 8. Please do not bring anything on your person additionally beyond required materials to limit cleaning and exposure.
- 9. Prayer requests are welcomed to Pastor Matt by phone, email, text, mail, and in person.

# OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD IS PREPARING (for Christmas, in July!)

To lighten our preparations in the fall and at the end of the year, we are collecting each month certain designated staples to fill our Operation Christmas Child ("OCC") boxes in the Jesus and Me ("JAM") Club. For June and July, we are collecting small, travel-sized combs, brushes, hair accessories (bows, elastics, bands, ribbons, and ties), and washcloths with boxed bar soap (preferably non or low-fragranced). Washcloths come in multipacks at Walmart, Dollar Tree, Sam's, Costco, and BJ's, as do boxed or individually-wrapped bar soaps. We cannot have a collection bin in the narthex due to Covid-19 restrictions but we will have a labeled collection container in the JAM room at the end of the Adult Wing. Alternatively, if you would like to make a monetary donation to the attention of JAM OCC Boxes, we are happy to shop online or at brick and mortar stores to purchase these fundamentals for our boxes due in mid November. # Food Pantry to Partner with Operation Blessing


Beginning the third week of July, Foundry's Food Pantry will be participating in Operation Blessing's Food to Freedom program. For a monthly membership fee of \$250, we will be able to obtain a full pallet (about 1200 lbs) of staple food items; another pallet of perishable items, including meat, frozen foods, and produce; fresh bread; diapers and adult disposables as they are available; and a box of assorted non-food items such as creams and cleaning supplies. The market value of these goods well exceeds the membership fee and is sufficient to feed about 50 families a month.

This new venture will introduce some changes to the way we currently stock and manage our food pantry, which is supported by direct donations of food and monetary donations. To make sure pantry shelves are stocked, Jean Walmsley, Tom Brabrand, Nancy Keel, and Karen Sanders have quietly and faithfully shopped grocery store sales to make use of the generous financial donations the pantry has come to depend upon. Flo Boyce and Zoie Linden greet and register new guests. Food has always been directly donated, with a huge increase in direct donations since the start of the pandemic quarantine to alleviate shopping duties for the food pantry staff. Bill Shedlock and Sandy Grover have helped with receiving those donations. And did you know that the Panera bread we distribute has been picked up from the store after closing 9:00 on Sunday evenings and packaged by Judy Brabrand? The dedication of the staff is awe-inspiring.

Once we begin to get food from Operation Blessing, we will need additional volunteers to pick up and unload the food and stock the pantry. This will require a truck large enough to carry two-1200 lb pallets about 3' x 3' x 3' in dimensions. Minimum size to fit two pallets is a pickup truck with an 8' bed. If a truck is not available through the congregation, food pantry funds will be used to rent a truck each month.

The pantry is currently serving about 64 families a month. While we have experienced





In 2020, Operation Christmas Child hopes to collect enough shoebox gifts to reach another 11 million children in countries like Peru, the Philippines, Rwanda and Ukraine. More than 10.5 million

shoebox gifts were collected worldwide in 2019, with more than 8.9 million collected in the U.S and over 200 filled by Foundry and delivered by our youth to a drop-off location! This year our goal is 100 boxes.

What is Operation Christmas Child? The Samaritan's Purse project collects shoebox gifts filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift—filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received. Boat, train, camel, ox and donkey carts, on the backs of individuals traversing a swing bridge over a gorge, even llamas—



these are just some of the ways our Operation Christmas Child boxes make their way to the hands of children around the world.



Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 178 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 160 countries and territories. This mission and cause is the Jesus and Me ("JAM") Club's permanent mission at Foundry for our first through fifth grade elementary-aged students and Club members. We have consistently participated in the project with triple digit box donations nearly every year since 2012. Way to go FUMC!

If you are in a store, please pick up multipacks of small purse or backpack sized combs and brushes, hair elastics, barrettes for the month of May. In June, we will be collecting washcloths and individually-wrapped bars of soap (no liquids please). We have the plastic soap storage containers from a prior generous donation. Thank you for your support! **Each one reach one.**
